A BRIEF REPORT ON THE 1962 ULTRASONICS SYMPOSIUM

The Ultrasonics Symposium was held at Horace Mann Auditorium, Columbia University, New York City on November 28, 29, and 30, 1962. Columbia University School of Applied Science and Engineering Ad as the host. There were 235 paid registrations, 55 complimentary registrations for speakers and session chairmen and two nonpaving attendees, bringing the total to 292. The geographical distribution of those attending was 121 from the local area, 166 from more distant points in the U.S., 2 from Canada, 1 from England, 1 from Holland and I from France.

The program consisted of six technical sessions with 17 invited papers and 21 contributed papers. On Thursday night, November 29, a social hour and a banquet were held at the Men's Faculty Club, Columbia University. The after-dinner speaker was Dr. W. N. kellogg who presented a very interesting illustrated talk entitled "Porpoises and Sonar." About 50 people attended the social hour and banquet.

PUBLICATION OF PAPERS FROM THE 1962 ULTRASONICS SYMPOSIUM

The papers presented at the Symposium have generated considerable interest as evidenced by the numerous requests that have been received for information regarding where these papers can be found in print. All the authors presenting papers at the Symposium have been invited to publish their papers in the IEEE Transactions on Ultrasonics Engineering. Approximately half of the authors have indicated thay would do so. The April issue of the Fransactions, presently in preparation, will contain four of the Symposium papers. Eleven additional papers have been received are being processed. It is expected that these papers will appear issue published before September. An extra issue of the Transactions will be published before the end of 1963 if the number of papers on hand warrants this action.
